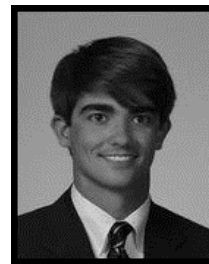
FROM THE DESK OF THE EDITOR IN CHIEF...

The Practice of Law in the 21st Century: The Intersection of Law & Technology

The *South Carolina Law Review* is hosting a Symposium titled *The Practice of Law in the 21st Century: The Intersection of Law & Technology*. The event will focus on a host of issues related to the intersection of, and the resulting gap between, law and technology in recent years. Our distinguished presenters, panelists, and authors are focusing on matters such as: emerging trends and best practices in electronic discovery, technology's impact on the ethical obligations of attorneys, and how the rules of evidence and civil procedure have each attempted—perhaps unsuccessfully—to keep pace with recent technological advances.

The Symposium will be held on Friday, March 1, 2013 at the University of South Carolina School of Law, following a keynote address by Bill Neukom and a reception on the evening of February 28, 2013. As the former Lead Counsel and Executive Vice President of Microsoft for nearly twenty-five years, past president of the ABA, and founding donor of The Neukom Institute for Computational Science at Dartmouth College, Mr. Neukom's wealth of experience in navigating the intersection of law and technology is without question. He will undoubtedly provide those in attendance with a unique perspective on how the law and the legal profession can catch up to, and keep pace with, recent changes in technology. The Symposium will also offer attendees five hours of CLE credit, including one hour of ethics credit.

Volume 64 is excited to announce the reintroduction of the Technology Editor position, which is now filled by 3L Christopher Jones. Chris will be tackling a number of projects this year, including a complete redesign of both the main *Law Review* and PRSM web sites (sclawreview.org and legalpeerreview.org), and he will also be developing an online registration system for the Symposium.

Chris has also worked to make Volume 63's Symposium Issue available in electronic format for purchase online through providers such as iTunes, Barnes & Noble, and Amazon. This is the first step in the process of simultaneously publishing all future issues electronically.

Finally, Chris will start the early development stage of an electronic spading system.

It is our hope that the Technology Editor position will both facilitate the internal operations of the *Law Review* and increase accessibility for our readers.
